Those routes with Gotjawal get dark quickly, so do not go into the route in the afternoon and hike in forward direction.

Route #11 Moseulpo – Mureung Olle

Life and death coexist on Route #11. There is modern history and there is contemporary history. It begins at Moseulpo-hang(harbor)(Hamo Sports Park). Moseul-bong(peak), the climax of this route, has the largest cemetery of the area. Jeju Olle restored 'The Long Lost Road' to the peak with support from the forest firewatchers. On top of Moseul-bong(peak), you can see the entire oreums and the sea in South-west Jeju beyond swaying Flame Grass. Gotjawal Olle between Sinpyeong and Mureung is an impressive hidden forest that was first introduced to the public by Jeju Olle.

Transportation

Direction to the starting point

From Jeju-si 1) Take English Education City Bus #755 at Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal or Jeju International Airport to Hamo Sports Park(60 minutes) → Walk 50m to the crossroads in front of Hong Mart → Walk down the alley between Hong Mart and Hamo Sports Park to find the starting point

2) Take Pyeonghwa-ro Bus #750-1~4 at Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal to go to Moseulpo Intercity Bus Terminal(60 minutes) → Walk 650m to Hamo Sports Park in direction of the ocean → Walk down the alley between Hong Mart and Hamo Sports Park to find the starting point

From Seogwipo-si Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Seogwipo Intercity Bus Terminal to go to Hamo-ri bus stop(45 minutes) → Walk 50m toward Boseong-ri → Walk for 5 minutes to the ocean on the right side at crossroads → Walk down the alley between Hong Mart and Hamo Sports Park to find the starting point

Direction from the Finishing point

To Jeju-si Walk back the route and turn left at the main road → Walk 300m → Take Town Loop Bus #950 at Jwagi-dong bus stop in front of the health center to go to Hamo-ri bus stop(20 minutes, Sinchang-Moseulpo) → Take Pyeonghwa-ro Bus #750

at Moseulpo Intercity Bus Terminal on the other side of the road to go to Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal(60 minutes)

To Seogwipo-si Walk back the route and turn left at the main road → Walk 300m → Take Town Loop Bus #950 at Jwagi-dong bus stop in front of the health center to go to Hamo-ri bus stop(20 minutes, Sinchang-Moseulpo) → Walk 50m past the crossroad to the side of Ewha Photo Studio → Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Hamo2-ri bus stop to go to Seogwipo Intercity Bus Terminal(40 minutes)

Attractions

Moseul-bong(peak) It is a towering oreum in the middle of Moseulpo plain in Daejeong-eup. Its name comes from its location in Moseulgae(Moseulpo). There is a bongsoodae(signal fire tower) from Chosun Dynasty at the top. Moseul is from a Jeju dialect Mosal, meaning sand.

Sinpyeong-Mureung Gotjawal Gotjawal in Jeju dialect is thicket. Well known for its thermal excellence, Gotjawal is a unique forest that both tropic and polar plants grow – possibly one and only in the world. Its color stays green throughout the winter and functions as the lung for our ecology by absorbing carbon dioxide. Sinpyeong-Mureung Gotjawal was first introduced to the public by Jeju Olle.
