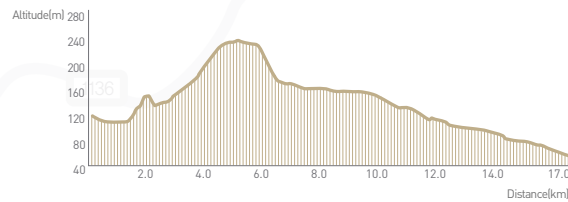

Route #14-1

Jeoji – Mureung Olle

This path that runs from Jeoji to Mureung allows the hiker to feel the vibrant green energy of the exuberant forests. The path from Jeoji Village continues through farm fields until it reaches dense forests. When you reach the peak of the Mudoji Oreum (small inactive volcano), where there are horses grazing on grass, you get a great view of Halla-san (mountain) and several oreums around the area. Gotjawal (forest) seems like a well-trimmed garden spread beneath your feet. Always stay keen on the route, as you can get lost easily in Gotjawal. The energy of the thick forest will cover your body. The road out of Gotjawal gives you a short break, passing through green tea fields. You are back in Gotjawal before you realize. The road seems a bit wide this time. This road takes you to the finishing point of Mureung 2-ri through Inhyang Village.

Transportation

Direction to the starting point

From Jeju-si 1) Take Bus #755 at Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal to O'Sulloc bus stop → Walk 100m to find another O'Sulloc bus stop → Take Bus #967 to Jeoji-ri bus stop → Across the street is the starting point

2) Take bus #750-1~4 at Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal to Sinpyeong-ri bus stop (60 minutes) → Change to Bus #950 to go to Jeoji-ri bus stop → Across the street is the starting point

From Seogwipo-si Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Seogwipo Intercity Bus Terminal to Hamo 3-ri bus stop (45 minutes) → Take Sinchang-Moseulpo Town Loop Bus #950 to Jeoji-ri bus stop (50 minutes) → Walk 50m toward Jeoji Community Center to find the starting point

To Jeju-si Take Sinchang-Moseulpo Town Loop Bus #950 at Inhyang-dong bus stop across Poolnaeum Diner to go to Hamo 3-ri bus stop (10~20 minutes) → Take Pyeonghwa-ro Bus #750-1~4 at Moseulpo bus stop on the opposite side to go to

Jeju-si

To Seogwipo-si Take Sinchang-Moseulpo Town Loop Bus #950 at Inhyang-dong bus stop across Poolnaeum Diner to go to Hamo 3-ri bus stop (10~20 minutes) → Walk 50m toward the crossroads and walk another 50m past the crossroads → Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Hamo 2-ri bus stop next to Ehwa Photo Studio to go to Seogwipo-si (40 minutes)

Attractions

Jeoji Arts Village This is a village of fine artists, located in Jeoji-ri in Hangyeong-myeon, Jeju-si. It is comprised of the Cultural Arts Center, shared workshops, outdoor showrooms, traditional cultural space, and individual workshops. And there is the provincial Jeju Museum of Modern Arts. You can check out artworks, tour the production, purchase artworks and participate in the making. You can also experience the traditional Jeju culture.

Mudoji Oreum The low-rising Mudoji Oreum (small inactive volcano) located near Gotjawal (forest) has a horseshoe-shaped crater that resembles a crescent moon. Excluding the cedar plantations, the entire surface is covered with Flame Grass. The region is used as grazing lands for horses.

O'Sulloc Tea Museum The largest tea museum in Korea, located in between the wide green tea fields of Jeju. It is a place where you can experience the culture and history of tea, from the epoch of three kingdoms up to Chosun Dynasty. You can also learn how to use tea utensils and teacups. You can enjoy the view of the boundless green tea fields at the observation deck.
