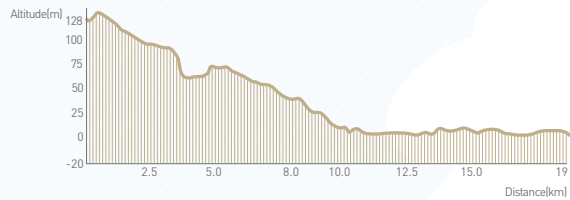

Route #14 Jeoji – Hallim Olle

The peaceful and homely Green Olle meets the cool and lively Blue Olle here. Past the open fields of Jeju's farm villages are dense forests, such as Gotjawal. Exit the comfy forests and follow the dry stream to arrive at the blue sea. You certainly cannot get bored while walking 19.3 kilometers of long journey along stone walls, farmlands, forests, rivers, tree-lined seaside walks, fine sandy beach and pathways through small villages. The wonderful scenery of Biyang-do(island) is visible through the entire walk. It is very interesting to see the island rotate little by little as you walk. The exploration team put in an extra effort to find trails and create a pathway, making possible the impossible. You can see their hard work throughout the entire route.

Transportation

Direction to the starting point

From Jeju-si 1) Take Bus #755 at Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal to O'Sulloc bus stop → Walk 100m to find another O'Sulloc bus stop → Take Bus #967 to Jeoji-ri bus stop → Across the street is the starting point

2) Take bus #750-1~4 at Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal to Sinpyeong-ri bus stop(60 minutes) → Change to Bus #950 to go to Jeoji-ri bus stop Across the street is the starting point

From Seogwipo-si Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Seogwipo Intercity Bus Terminal to Hamo 3-ri bus stop(45 minutes) → Take Sinchang-Moseulpo Town Loop Bus #950 to Jeoji-ri bus stop(50 minutes) → Walk 50m toward Jeoji Community Center to find the starting point

Direction from the Finishing point

To Jeju-si Walk back 100m and follow the road on the left for 3 minutes → Pass the crossroad to go to Hallim Catholic Church bus stop in front of Hallim Catholic Church → Take west bound intra-city bus #702 to go to Jeju-si

To Seogwipo-si Walk back 100m and follow the road on the left for 3 minutes →

Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Hallim Gas Station bus stop on the right side of the crossroad to go to Seogwipo-si

Attractions

Keunsonang(large pine tree) Forest Path A forest path with large pine trees. The name was given by Jeju Olle Foundation. 'Nang' means tree in Jeju dialect.

Guleongjin Forest Path A hollow, sunken terrain is called 'Guleongjida' in Jeju. Newly developed by Jeju Olle Foundation, the path was named Guleongjin Forest Path for many curves throughout the route.

Geumneung/Hyeopjae Beach These beaches have the most beautiful colors of the ocean. Geumneung Beach and Hyeopjae Beach are adjacent to each other. Both beaches glow in silver with seashells in the sand. The color of the ocean is stunning. It is a rather shallow beach with low slopes, good for playing in water with children. It was appointed an outstanding beach in 2007 by the Ministry of Maritime Affairs and Fisheries

Biyang-do (Island) Carry Biyang-do(island) in your sight as you hike from the midpoint of Route #14, Wollyeong Coast, Hallim-hang(harbor). It is entertaining to see different sides of the island by hiking the trail. Biyang-do is a volcanic island created from an eruption one thousand years ago, in 1002. It is one of the youngest volcanic islands in Jeju.

The region is famous for coral reefs formed by the abundant marine organisms and clear seawater. The inner crater of the Biyang-bong(peak) is the only place in Korea, where you can find wild Biyang Namu(*Oreocnide fruticosa*),(#48 Heritage of Jeju Special Self-Governing Province)
