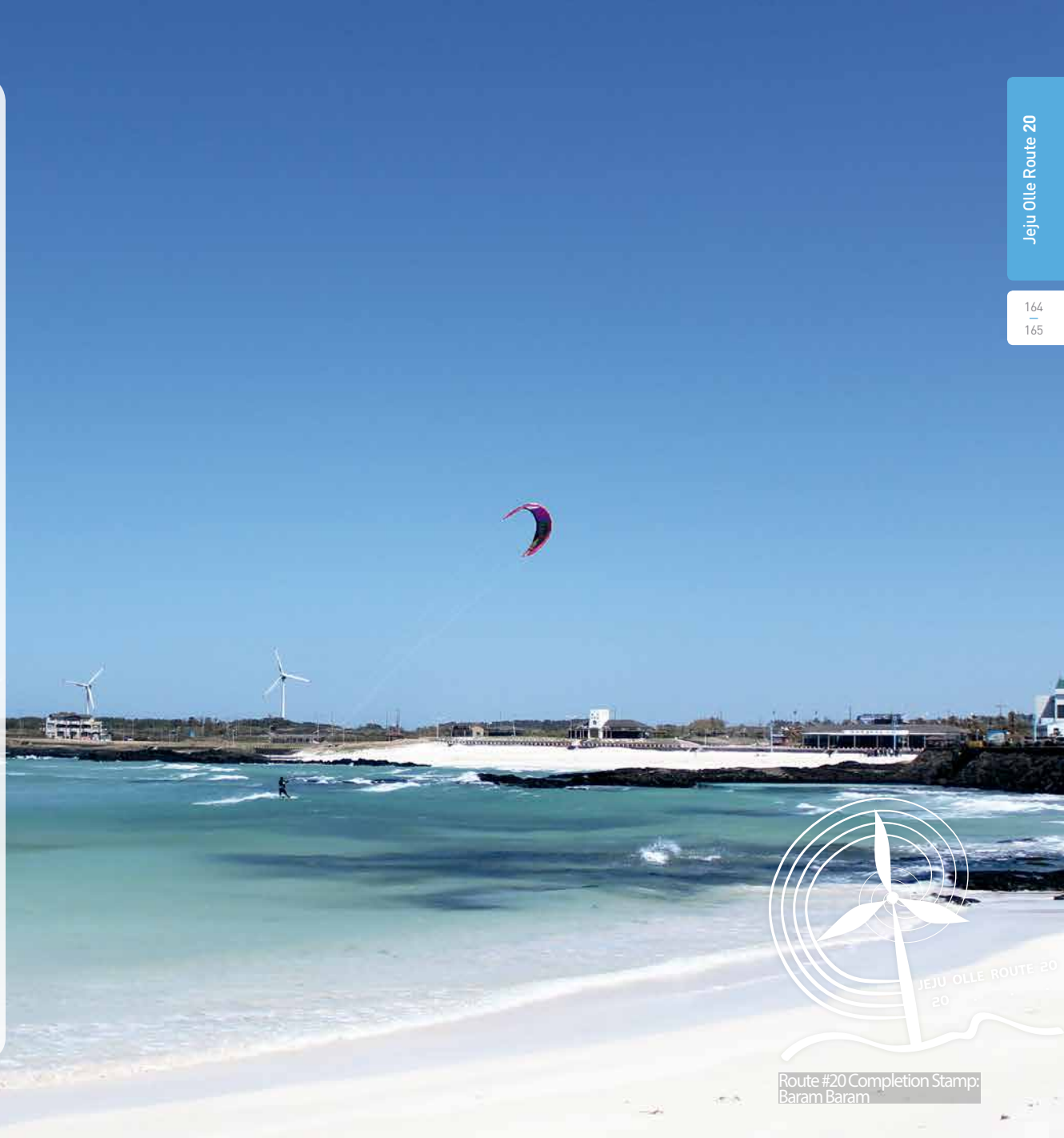

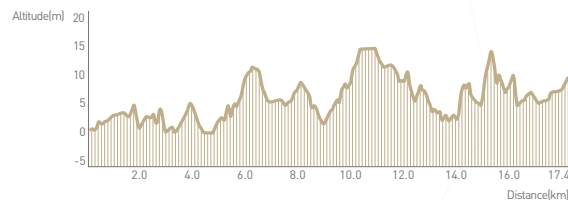

Route #20 Gimnyeong – Hado Olle

Jeju is an island of winds. Wind created Jeju's language, Jeju's doldam(stonewall), Jeju's nature and Jeju's culture. Gimnyeong-Hado Olle is Jeju Olle's 25th route. It is the road to Jeju's wind.

Transportation

Direction to the starting point

From Jeju-si Take east bound intra-city bus #701 at Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal to go to Gimnyeong-ri Namheul-dong bus stop(45 minutes) → Walk 500m toward the ocean from across → you will find the starting point inside an open space in direction of the ocean

From Seogwipo-si Take east bound intra-city bus #701 at Seogwipo Intercity Bus Terminal to go to Gimnyeong-ri Namheul-dong bus stop(120 minutes) → Walk 500m toward the ocean from across → you will find the starting point inside an open space in direction of the ocean

Direction from the Finishing point

To Jeju-si Face away from Jeju Haenyeo Museum and walk 200m → Take east bound intra-city bus #701 at Sangdo-ri Haenyeo Museum bus stop on the left side to go to Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal(70 minutes)

To Seogwipo-si Face away from Jeju Haenyeo Museum and walk 200m → Take east bound intra-city bus #701 at Sangdo-ri Haenyeo Museum bus stop across to go to Jeju Intercity Bus Terminal(95 minutes)

Attractions

Gimnyeong Seongsegi Beach Bright white fine sand beach. Water level even throughout, Aquamarine Ocean is just right for swimming. Those who love kite surf-

ing gather to enjoy the wind. They have a great campsite.

Ywaga Yeondae(signal smoke tower) Yeondae is an old military facility from years ago, functions like a communication post with Bongsoodae(signal fire tower). Most Bongsoodae is on the mountaintop and Yeondae on hill areas, but Jeju built Yeondae at certain points where one could secure the full view of the ocean. There are 38 Yeondae's in Jeju. They communicate with one another by smoke in the daytime and light in the nighttime. On a cloudy or rainy day, Yeondae keepers would run to the points nearby to deliver emergent news. 23-15 Heritage of Jeju Special Self-Governing Province

Haengwon-pogu(port), Eodeungpo It is a sojourn monument put up during the banishment of Chosun's 15th King of Gwanghaegun. He was dethroned for Injobanjeong after a long conflict around succession and administration with powers. He was first banished to Gwanghwa-do(island), Tae'an and Eodeungpo in June 6, 1637 – the year of the Manchu War. He was relocated in the west of Manggyeong-ru of the main castle(the old section of a city). He passed away at the age of 67 after 4 years and 4 months of the exile. Gwanghaegun is the most royal individual of all those who were banished to Jeju, but there is no remain of his dwellings then.

Haenyeo Museum It is a museum of Jeju Haenyeo's life and culture. There is a reproduction of Badatga-bulteok, the workplace for Jeju's Haenyeos and the fishing village, and display of Haenyeo apparel and tools(such as Tewak, Mangsari, etc.). You can look around and also listen to commentaries of cultural tourism interpreter. (Commentary at 10 am, 11 am, 1 pm, 2 pm, 5 pm) There is Haenyeo performance in the lobby every Saturday at 3 pm. There is a separate Haenye Experience Zone for children. The museum closes on Mondays.
