09 Daepyeong - Hwasun Olle

Friendship Trail: Lebanon Mountain Trail

Total Distance: 7.5km
Total Time: 3~4 hour
Difficulty: High

Total distance of the route is half the others, but Wolla-bong(peak) uphill road is pretty tough. There are dense forests around Baksugijeong and Weolla-bong(peak), so you should never enter the route past 3 pm. It is easy to get lost after sunset.

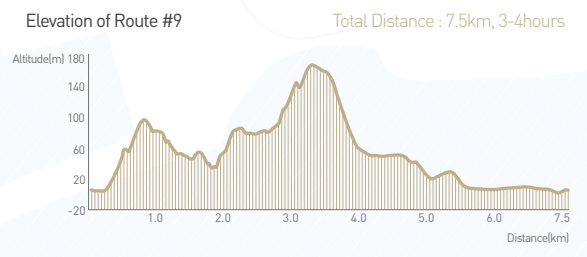
Restaurants for Lunch

Route #9

Daepyeong – Hwasun Olle

We start off at a small and friendly village of Daepyeong-pogu(port), follow Moljil(horse path), where horses walked, and encounter Baksugijeong – a vast meadow on top of a cliff. In the old days, Jeju's fine quality ponies were raised at Baksugijeong, shipped to Daepyeong-pogu(port) by Moljil and sent to Won Dynasty. Baksugijeong connects to Bollenang-gil(pathway) with lots of linden trees. Weollabong(peak) uphill road is challenging, but the beautiful scenery on the way is definitely worthwhile. Andeok Valley allows you to peek into the true Jeju, maintaining the look of the primitive times. It is one of the most beautiful valleys in Jeju Island.

Transportation

Direction to the starting point

From Jeju-si Take Jungmun Express Bus #782, 782-1 or 782-2 to go to Yerae Entrance(50 minutes) → Walk to Sangye Entrance and take intercity bus #120(Dongseo Transportations) to go to Daepyeong-ri bus stop(10 minutes) → Walk 10 minutes through the alley on the right side of Daepyeong Supermarket to find the starting point

From Seogwipo-si Take intercity Bus #120 at Central Rotary bus stop(West) to go to Daepyeong-ri bus stop(40 minutes) → Walk 10 minutes through the alley on the right side of Daepyeong Supermarket to find the starting point

Direction from the Finishing point

To Jeju-si 1) Walk 50m toward Route #10 → Walk another 10 minutes on the road to your right at the three-way intersection → Turn left at Hwasun Crossroads and walk 50m until you find Andeok Nonghyup bus stop → Take Pyeonghwa-ro Bus #750-1 at Andeok Nonghyup bus stop(via Sagye~Hwasun, 60 minutes) to go to Jeju-si

To Seogwipo-si Walk 50m toward Route #10 → Walk another 10 minutes on the road to your right at the three-way intersection → Turn left at Hwasun Crossroads and walk 50m until you find Andeok Nonghyup bus stop → Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Andeok Nonghyup bus stop to go to Seogwipo-si(30 minutes)

Attractions

Baksugijeong Steep cliffs next to Daepyeong-pogu(port). Gijeong is a Jeju dialect for a cliff. Baksu means drinking spring water from the bedrock with a large bowl. The spring water is well known to be good for skincare. Many come to this spot on the Buddhist All Souls' Day(the 15th day of the 7th lunar month).

Moljil(horse path) It used to be the road for ponies. It is said that Moljil(horse path) was built to send ponies, raised in the Jungsangan area of Western Jeju, from Daepyeong-pogu(port) to Won Dynasty during Korea Dynasty.

Bollenang-gil(pathway) Linden tree is called Bollenang in Jeju. The name is self-explanatory. There are lots of linden trees. Past Moljil(horse path) and Gijeong-ri(pathway) is a walkway filled with Bollenang.

Bongsoodae(signal fire tower) It is a communication mechanism, used back in Chosun Dynasty to watch enemies. This Bongsoodae(signal fire tower) communicated with Sanbang Yeondae below Sanbang-san(mountain).

Andeok Valley This valley boasts deep and dense scenery. The primitive forest around the valley is a Natural Heritage. It's also called as Ollengyiso as it welcomes lots of wild ducks. Ollengyi means duck in Jeju dialect. Korean scholars, such as Junghee Kim and On Jung, were exiled to Andeok Valley. They raised disciples, while enjoying the great view.
