Total Time: 4~5 hour

Difficulty: Medium

There is a rocky road in the beginning and few uphill roads, such as Sanbang Yeondae or Songak-san(mountain). The rest is a flat road.

Restaurants for Lunch

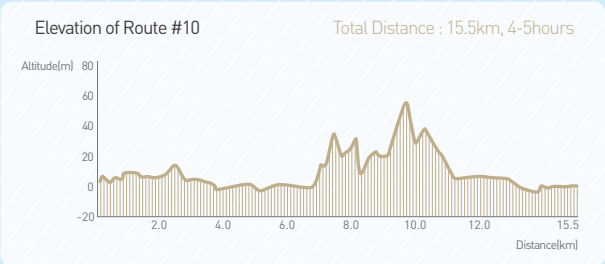

Route #10 Hwasun – Moseulpo Olle

The coastal Olle route begins Hwasun Golden Sand Beach and ends at Hamo in Daejeong-eup, passing by Sanbang-san(mountain) and through Songak-san(mountain). You can see Mara-do and Gapa-do from not too far and enjoy the beauty of Hallasan beyond Sanbang-san(mountain), oreums and Yeongsil Valley. First introduced by Jeju Olle, Sogemmak Hangmandae below Sanbang-san(mountain) draws your eyes. Waves are calm at Hwasun Golden Sand Beach, good enough for nude surfing. Yongcheonsoo outdoor swimming pool is the place to go in summer.

Transportation

Direction to the starting point

From Jeju-si Take Pyeonghwa-ro Bus #750-1(via Sagye~Hwasun, 60 minutes) to go to Anduk Nonghyup bus stop → Walk 100m toward Gamsan-ri → Walk 10 minutes into Hwashin Fishing Alley across to find the starting point

From Seogwipo-si Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Seogwipo Intercity Bus Terminal to go to Anduk Nonghyup bus stop(30 minutes) → Walk 100m toward Gamsan-ri → Walk 10 minutes into Hwashin Fishing Alley across to find the starting point

Direction from the Finishing point

To Jeju-si 1) Take English Education City Bus #755 at Hamo Sports Park bus stop to go to Jeju-si(60 minutes)

2) Walk 650m toward Moseulpo Finishing Point along the main road and take Pyeonghwa-ro Bus #750 at Moseulpo Finishing Point Intercity Bus Stop to go to Jeju-si(60 minutes)

To Seogwipo-si Follow the main road for 5 minutes and walk to your right for another 50m at Nonghyup Crossroads → Take west bound intra-city bus #702 at Hamo2-ri bus stop to go to Seogwipo-si(40 minutes)

Attractions

Hwasun Golden Sand Beach Small, yet beautiful beach. The sand is soft and the water is not too deep, good to play with children. You can see Hyeongje-seom(island) in the ocean and Sanbang-san(mountain) on the land. You can also use Yongcheonsoo outdoor swimming pool for free.

Sanbang Yeondae(signal smoke tower) Yeondae is a column built on the front in Chosun Dynasty. They dug a trench around the Yeondae and built a temporary building to keep all kinds of armories and daily necessities. 6 generals and 12 soldiers were assigned.

Songak-san(mountain) / Jeolwoolyi Oreum There are small and big craters on Songak-san(mountain), unlike other oreums. 260 feet deep crater at the highest peak is still covered with dark red ashes. You can see Gapa-do(island), Mara-do(island) and Hyeongje-seom(island) at once. Jeolwoolyi means screaming wave. Once you are on Songak-san(mountain), you can see Sanbang-san(mountain) and Hallasan(mountain) to the North and Gapa-do(island), Mara-do(island) and Hyeongje-seom(island) to the South. There are Jinji Caves along the coastal cliff, created by Japanese at the end of Taepyeongyang War – makes you solemn from the pain of the modern history.

Hamo Beach It is also known as Melke Beach, where lots of Mels(anchovies) were caught in the past. The sand is soft and the water level is shallow. It is where Hamel, the dutch, was drifting in Chosun Dynasty.
